

<p>Give some symptoms of colic.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rolling • Nipping at stomach • Stretching out • Sweating • Discomfort • Off feed • May sit down like a dog. 	<p>Describe how to count the respiration rate on a horse.</p> <p>Watch the sides of your horses as he breathes in and out, or place a hand on his side to count the number of times he breathes per minute.</p>
<p>Why do you deworm your pony?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To keep him parasite-free • To lower the risk of colic 	<p>Describe a healthy Pony. (3 signs)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alert & contented • Eyes are clear and bright • Coat is shiny & skin is loose and supple • Does not lie down for long periods of time • Stands normally on all 4 legs • Eats and drinks normally • Passes manure about 8 times/day. • Urine is clear or light yellow
<p>Which immunizations need to be given every six months?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WN • Flu Rhino 	<p>How do you know if your Pony is lame?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hoof beats sound uneven, “CLIP, clop.” • When a pony is lame, he favors his sore leg. He may stand with his weight on the good leg & rest the sore one. • Sore foreleg: will throw his head up when steps on the sore leg. Sore leg usually takes a shorter step. • Sore hind: hip is carried higher on the sore side, and head goes down when sore hind hits ground.

<p>Where is the best place to count the heart rate on a horse?</p> <p>Either with a stethoscope or on the side of his neck in the groove –use your fingers not your thumb.</p>	<p>Give some signs of Laminitis. (Founder)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fever in the feet • Stands with front legs out ahead of him • Lies down and does not want to get up.

<p>Name 2 vaccines that your pony needs. (not already mentioned)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WN • Flu Rhino • Rabies • VEWT • Strangles 	<p>Give 2 reasons to call your vet</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pony is in distress. • You know your pony has a health problem but you don't know what to do to fix it. • Pony needs vaccines & coggins. • Pony needs teeth floated.
<p>What are 2 signs of a distressed pony?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Won't eat • Looks very sick • Badly hurt 	<p>Name 2 vaccines your pony needs. (not already mentioned)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WN • Flu Rhino • Rabies • VEWT • Strangles
<p>If your pony is colicing, what should you do?</p> <p>Cal the vet and keep pony moving.</p>	<p>Why should your pony be routinely checked by the vet?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vaccines • Coggins • Dental care
<p>If your pony has fever in his feet, what sickness might he have?</p> <p>Laminitis/founder</p>	<p>What is the normal body temperature of a horse?</p> <p>100-101</p>
<p>What is normal respiratory rate of the horse?</p> <p>14-20</p>	<p>What is the normal pulse rate of the horse?</p> <p>30-40 beats per minute</p>
